Printing and Finishing Guide

This file is for making lesson booklets that are bound with either spiral or comb binding. We prefer the spiral binding if the equipment is available. The content of the booklet is the same as in the stapled booklets, but this format is

- * Easier to make
- * Better for use during presentations (because the pages don't turn by themselves)
- * Typically more expensive
- * Typically this results in a thicker (less portable) booklet
- * Better picture quality.

Materials:

Select paper that is not easily torn and that produces the nicest quality pictures on your printer. When printing on our Cannon inkjet printer with the standard ink, we prefer to use the Office Depot brand Premium High Gloss Photo Paper (Item # 652-001), because we like the image quality and the the resulting product is essentially water resistant.

For the front and back covers, we cut standard clear plastic presentation cover sheets to be the same size as the booklet.

Printing:

- 1. Print on only one side of the pages by using Adobe Acrobat Reader's settings: Both Odd and Even Pages
 - Auto-Center
 - Pages 1-end
 - If printing on European A4 paper size, depending on which printer model you are using, it might be necessary to choose the option to reduce oversized pages to fit.

Finishing:

- 1. Place this page on top of the rest of the printed pages and enough clear cover pages to make front and back covers for each booklet.
- 2. Cut on the solid lines to make pages that are about 9.95cm wide and 13.35cm tall. You can reduce the number of cuts by stacking partly cut pages for the remaining cuts, but careful planning is required.
- 3. Arrange the pages into their final order. Page numbers are on the bottom center of each page following the cover page.
- 4. Punch holes for binding along the top edge of the pages and covers.
- 5. Bind the pages to form the booklets.

The Seven Churches


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This is the beginning of a series of studies on the book of Revelation and related prophecies. Although Revelation can be hard to understand, it is worthwhile to study, because there is a blessing promised to those who read and study it.¹ It is believed to have been written in AD 96² by the apostle John, while he was a prisoner on the island of Patmos for the word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ.³

John saw a vision of Jesus⁴ holding seven stars in His right hand, and walking among seven golden candlesticks. Jesus explained that the stars were the angels, or messengers, of the churches,⁵ and the candlesticks were the seven churches in Asia Minor.⁶



Jesus instructed John,⁷ "Write the things which thou hast seen, and the things which are, and the things which shall be hereafter;" John recorded in his gospel the things he had seen. In Revelation chapters 2 and 3, Jesus was telling John specific messages to give to the seven churches that were in Asia Minor at that time. The rest of Revelation⁸ was telling John what would happen in the future from his time.⁹

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This study will focus on the specific messages to the churches, because they tell us how to prepare for the future events. Jesus emphasized that everyone should listen carefully to these messages, when He repeatedly said, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit sayeth unto the churches."

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Typical Message

Description of Jesus
Praise for doing right
Description of wrong
Punishment for wrong
Blessing for repenting

The typical message begins with a description of Jesus, and some praise from Jesus about what that church is doing right. From this part of the message, we can see what we should also try to do. Then, Jesus explains what they are doing wrong, and a punishment for them if they do not change those behaviors. From this part, we can understand what behaviors we should also avoid. Jesus ends the messages with a blessing promised for people who are faithful to Him to the end. We can be comforted and encouraged by these promises, too.

Inscription in Ephesus with City's Name

Unto the angel of the church of Ephesus write; These things saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand, who walketh in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks; Revelation 2:1

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
