This is the beginning of a series of studies on the book of Revelation and related prophecies. Although Revelation can be hard to understand, it is worthwhile to study, because there is a blessing promised to those who read and study it.<sup>1</sup> It is believed to have been written in AD 96<sup>2</sup> by the apostle John, while he was a prisoner on the island of Patmos for the word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ.<sup>3</sup>



John saw a vision of  $Jesus^4$  holding seven stars in His right hand, and walking among seven golden candlesticks. Jesus explained that the stars were the angels, or messengers, of the churches,<sup>5</sup> and the candlesticks were the seven churches in Asia Minor.<sup>6</sup>



Jesus instructed John,<sup>7</sup> "Write the things which thou hast seen, and the things which are, and the things which shall be hereafter;" John recorded in his gospel the things he had seen. In Revelation chapters 2 and 3, Jesus was telling John specific messages to give to the seven churches that were in Asia Minor at that time. The rest of Revelation<sup>8</sup> was telling John what would happen in the future from his time.<sup>9</sup>



This study will focus on the specific messages to the churches, because they tell us how to prepare for the future events. Jesus emphasized that everyone should listen carefully to these messages, when He repeatedly said, "He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit sayeth unto the churches."

The typical message begins with a description of Jesus, and some praise from Jesus about what that church is doing right. From this part of the message, we can see what we should also try to do. Then, Jesus explains what they are doing wrong, and a punishment for them if they do not change those behaviors. From this part, we can understand what behaviors we should also avoid. Jesus ends the messages with a blessing promised for people who are faithful to Him to the end. We can be comforted and encouraged by these promises, too.

- <sup>3</sup> Revelation 1:9 (p. 2)
- <sup>4</sup> To see that the person standing among the candlesticks is Jesus, consider these verses: Rev. 1:1 This book is Jesus' message to John, Rev 1:13 He looks like the Son of man, which is a title Jesus frequently used for himself (Luke 22:48, John 8:28, about 80 other times in the Gospels). Rev 2:18 This person is called the Son of God. (p. 3)

- <sup>7</sup> Revelation 1:19 (p. 4)
